Results	PLO 2: Integrate biblical concepts and principles in the management decision-making process.
	Based on the results, the PLO was not met. Only 53% of students were able to integrate biblical concepts and principles in the management and decision-making process.

	Demonstrate the technical skills and competencies required to effectively manage
	the functional areas of global business operations.
	Based on the results, the PLO was not met. Only 36% of students demonstrated the technical skills and competencies to manage the functional areas of global business operations effectively.
Discussion of Results	PLO 2: The assignment includes a step-by-step guide for developing the shared vision and multiple bible references for each step to assist students with the integration of a Christian worldview. However, students were unable to provide a fully developed shared organizational vision based on Christian principles.
	PLO 5: Only a small percentage of students analyzed all of the relevant aspects of the supply chain as outlined in the case study. Thirty-six percent of students were able to evaluate three components (1) the firm's activities for value creation, (2) financial risk, and (3) logistic models for supply chain optimization. The failed artifacts were primarily due to missing content and incomplete analysis of one or more of the components.
Proposed Changes	PLO 2: Students are required to develop a shared organizational vision and communication plan. A scholarly article that explains the process for developing a shared organizational vision and an example will be added to the assignment resources. The document was submitted and added to the course by the E-learning team on March 30, 2022.
	PLO 5: Add a sample of a fully developed value chain analysis. A request was submitted to E-Learning and the document was added to the course on March 31, 2022.
Rationale for Proposed Changes	PLO 2: The sample shared organizational development plan will provide students with an example to follow and use as an outline for developing a similar plan for their chosen organization.
	PLO 5: An example of the final outcome will help students visualize the end goal for the assignment.
